WALKING THE ANCIENT PATHS A Spiritual and Educational Study Tour Israel – The Land of the Bible May 22 – June 1, 2024

The Old Testament prophets and their writings set the stage for the coming of the Messiah and the establishment of the New Testament church. Grasping the historical setting of every scripture is vital for precise interpretation. Immersing oneself in on-site exploration and engaging with the geo-political terrain, along with the archaeological findings, unveils the captivating narrative that propelled the early church in the second century. Standing upon sacred ground, one can almost feel the presence of the prophets, Jesus, and the apostles springing to life.

- 1. Comprehend and articulate the geographical characteristics of the Middle East, along with the progression of historical incidents that unfolded within the region.
- 2. Recognize biblical locations and territories on a map, along with comprehending the functions these sites fulfilled within biblical narratives.
- 3. Investigate the particulars encompassing the journeys undertaken by the prophets, Jesus, and the apostles. Witnessing the authentic routes firsthand will enhance students' capability to position events within a comprehensive framework.
- 4. The study tour will ultimately contribute to the precise interpretation and adept application of biblical texts.

Day 1 Wednesday – May 22

Today, we board our flight for the land of the Bible, Israel!

Day 2 Thursday - May 23

Arrive at **Ben Gurion Airport, Tel Aviv, Israel** where we are greeted, assisted, and transferred to our hotel by the EpicTOURS staff.

If the flight arrives early enough in the day, we will tour Jaffa (Joppa), in the southern, oldest part of **Tel Aviv-Jaffa**, an ancient port city in <u>Israel</u>. Jaffa is famous for its association with the biblical stories of Jonah, Solomon, and Saint Peter as well as the mythological story of Andromeda and Perseus. Overnight on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea! Open your Bible and let your mind drink in the Biblical history you are about to personally experience. You are in the Holy Land! After checking into our hotel, a sumptuous Israeli dinner is served: then, we rest from the long journey to prepare us for our first full day of touring.

Day 3 Friday – May 24 - Caesarea/Mt. Carmel/Tel-Megido/Nazareth Village/Mt. Precipice/Tiberias

We awake in the Holy Land to a sumptuous Israeli breakfast buffet, then we board the deluxe motor coach and head north on the Coastal Road to view the stately, ancient ruins of **Caesarea**, visiting the **Roman amphitheater** where Paul stood trial. It was here that the Holy Spirit first fell on the Gentiles as Cornelius, the first Gentile of the Church-age, met Peter. http://www.bible-history.com/archaeology/israel/3-caesarea-ancient-bb.html Next, we drive up the Mediterranean Coast to **Mount Carmel**, Elijah's Cave, the place where the Prophet Elijah defeated the false prophets of Ba'al and where God answered by fire. We continue today by driving through the Valley of Jezreel (Google Valley of Jezreel for information) - the prophetic future site of the battle of **Armageddon**. The archaeological site of **Megiddo** is one of Solomon's chariot cities where twenty civilizations can be observed stacked up in the ruins. Driving toward Nazareth, we stop to visit an extraordinary site called Nazareth Village, where we step back in time to see a day in the life of the first century Jews who lived in Nazareth. We will visit Mt. Precipice which is located south of Nazareth, on the cliffs of Mt Kedumim (397M), overlooking the Yizrael Valley and view **Mount Tabor**. This is considered by some to be the place where angry Jewish worshippers drove Jesus away from the Synagogue, attempted to throw him of the cliffs, and he disappeared before their eyes "in the midst of them".

• Dinner, then gather for worship and student instruction. Overnight in Tiberias.

Day 4 Saturday – May25 - Explore The Galilee- Lake Kinerret/ Mr. Arbel/Magdala/ Boat ride on the Sea of Galilee/St. Peter's Fish Lunch/Capernaum/Mount of the Beatitudes/Tabgha/Bethseda/Kurazim/Kursi (Pig Jump)

After another great Israeli breakfast, we start our day with a service on the Galilee. Stepping aboard a **Galilee boat** for a calm cruise on the sea, we enjoy an incredible worship service on the boat. It will be life changing! For many pilgrims to the Holy Land, this is one of the most memorable experiences. Later, we disembark at **Ginosar** for a short trip to **Capernaum, the hometown of Jesus.** Here he met James, John, Peter, and Andrew. The healing of Jairus' daughter, as did the healing of the woman who touched Jesus' garment (Luke 8:40-56). We visit the home of the Apostle Peter where Jesus healed his mother-in-law. Leaving Capernaum, we ascend to **Tabgha** where Jesus multiplied the fishes and loaves. We lunch on the shores of the Sea of Galilee and enjoy a special feast of St. Peter's Fish. A short bus ride takes us to the **Mount of** **Beatitudes** where we hear the words of Jesus on the mount where the greatest sermon ever was preached. The final event of the day is designed for those who wish to baptized or renew their baptism. The Yardenit baptismal site is located on the Jordan River After baptism, we return to the hotel where another Israeli buffet presents an amazing variety of food for our dinner.

• After dinner, students gather in a meeting room for worship and a session conducted by the professor.

Day 5 Sunday – May 26 - Golan Heights/Tel Dan/Caesarea Philippi

After breakfast, we travel to Tel Dan Nature Reserve at the North of Israel. The site is in the Golan Heights near a natural spring, once associated with the Greek god Pan. It had been inhabited for 2,000 years, until it was abandoned and destroyed following the Six Day War in 1967. It is located at the foot of Mt. Hermon. The spring is the source of the Banias river, one of the main tributaries of the Jordan river. It is one of the most beautiful National parks of the country. Its noisy small brooks and rivers, evergreen forest an natural paths are tremendously beautiful. But this is also the site of the ancient Temple which used to *compete* with the Temple at Jerusalem.

The Nature Reserve Banias was believed by the Ancients to be the **Gateway to the Underground World, the Hades.** The remnants of the antique temples still stand. Another outstanding attraction of this site are the excavations of the Ancient Caesareas Philippi town. Here, Jesus disclosed his Nature before the Apostles (Matthew 16) and referred to the god Pan and the heathen temple when he declared the "gates of hell" will not prevail. **Finally, we stop at Banias** Waterfall, Ein Panias Rout 99, Qiryat Shemona Israel. This is the biggest and the most powerful waterfall in Israel. Its beauty is unprecedented.

• After dinner, students gather in a meeting room for worship and a session conducted by the professor.

Day 6 Monday – May 27 The Jordan Valley

After breakfast, we check out of our hotel and travel to Beit Shean https:// en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Beit She%27an to visit one of the best preserved Roman **Amphitheaters** in Israel. Extensive excavations have uncovered eighteen layers of civilizations. Ancient Beit Shean is also where King Saul's body was retrieved by the brave men of Jabesh Gilead. We travel south passing Jericho, the "City of Palms" spreading out on the west side of the Jordan River at 825 feet below sea level. The biblical site of Tell es-Sultan is in the distance, as is the location of city Joshua destroyed. In Jesus' day a new center had been constructed on the wadi banks by the Hasmonean rulers and Herod the Great. Continuing south, we see Qumran, https://en.wikipedia.org/ wiki/Qumran where the famous Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered by a little shepherd boy and Ein Gedi where David fled from Saul. At Ein Gedi we will hike to the first water falls to visit the oasis in the desert. Continuing south through the wilderness of Judea, we will ascend by cable car to Masada (by 12:00 p.m.), the fortress built by King Herod the Great. Step back in time to 66 CE when a group of Jewish rebels overcame the Roman garrison of Masada http://www.jewishvirtuallibrary.org/masada-desert-fortress and settled on the top of Masada until 73 CE when the Roman governor laid siege. The view of the Roman camps can still be seen from atop Masada, as well as a spectacular view of the country of Jordan and the **Dead Sea.** Visit the remains of Herod's Palace, the Apartments, Baths, Storehouses and Cisterns. It was here the Jewish Zealots made their last stand against the Roman Legions from 70-73 AD. Descend from Masada with a stunning view of

the Dead Sea. We continue north along the shore of the Dead Sea. An opportunity to float in the Dead Sea may be offered if arrival at hotel before sundown.

• After dinner, students gather in a meeting room for worship and a session conducted by the professor.

Dinner and Overnight - Dead Sea Hotel

Day 7 Tuesday – May 28 - Jerusalem/Temple Mount/Mt Olives/Garden of Gethsemene/Hulda Gates/Southern Steps excavations

If there isn't time for the Dead Sea experience the previous evening, then before breakfast they can float in Dead Sea. We travel up to Jerusalem to feast our souls and eyes on the most sacred place on earth. Jerusalem, Jerusalem, lift up your voice and sing, Hosanna to our King! A breathtaking view of the Temple Mount (Mt. Moriah Genesis 22:2) is seen from the Mount of Olives. The Mount of Olives is where Jesus will return, and the Temple Mount is where the 3rd Temple will be rebuilt prior to His appearing. After enjoying the view of Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives, we visit the **Church of All Nations** and prav and worship in the Garden of Gethsemane with a grand view of the Eastern Gate and the Kidron Valley. Here, we read the Scriptures of Jesus' prayer and take time for personal reflection where we literally walk where Jesus walked. A private prayer garden will be arranged by Epic tours. Crossing the Kidron Valley, we begin a tour of the old city of Jerusalem. As we begin the tour of old Jerusalem, we visit St. Ann's Church and hear the marvelous acoustics as we sing. Visit the **Pool of Bethesda** where the angel stirred the waters for healing. Continue to the Antonio Fortress and the Lithostrotos, the scene of the trial of Jesus. See the etchings in the stone where the Roman soldiers played the Game of the King and mocked Jesus with the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Following the path from Pilate's Judgement Hall through the old city, we experience the sights and sounds of old Jerusalem as we journey toward the Western Wall to arrive before sunset. We walk the Via Dolorosa, the route that Jesus took between his condemnation by Pilate and his crucifixion and burial. Just below the Temple Mount, on the western side we will pray at the Western Wall (Kotel) which is the closest wall to where the Holy of Holies was located when the Temple was in use during the 1st Century. Visit the Western Wall Tunnel which will take you underground. A large portion of the Western Wall is inaccessible, otherwise. You will see stones, models and actual structures which provide clues as to how the Second Temple was constructed. In addition, these artifacts help explain the history of this area through the eyes of all the great empires that once ruled Jerusalem.

• After dinner, students gather in a meeting room for worship and a session conducted by the professor.

Dinner and Overnight - Jerusalem

Day 8 Wednesday – May 29 - Jerusalem, Old City

We will visit one of the most incredible sites in all of Judaism: The **Temple Mount**. It is here where the Temple era came to an abrupt halt as it was destroyed by the Romans in 70 AD. Leaving the Temple Mount, we drive to the City of David, at the Gihon Spring, where we learn of how the original city of Jerusalem was established. by King David, overtaking from the Jebusites. Next, we'll visit **Hezekiah's Tunnel**: A 1750-foot tunnel carved during the reign of Hezekiah to bring water from one side of the city to the other, Hezekiah's Tunnel together with the 6th c. tunnel of Euphalios in Greece are considered the greatest works of water engineering technology in the pre-Classical period. The **Pool of Siloam** is a rock-cut pool on the southern slope of the **City of David**, the original site of **Jerusalem**, located outside the walls of the Old City to the southeast. The pool was fed by the waters of the Gihon Spring, carried there by two aqueducts. Traveling

to **Bethlehem** in the afternoon, we will visit the **Church of the Nativity and the Shepherds Fields**. We will eat lunch at a local restaurant with a Bedouin flavor,

The Tent, enjoyable by all who have visited! Great shopping opportunities in Bethlehem! The shop, The Good Shepherd Store, is owned and operated by our Apostolic brethren. We will be a blessing to them. Their specialty is olive wood carving and other great souvenirs.

• After dinner, students gather in a meeting room for worship and a session conducted by the professor.

Dinner and Overnight - Jerusalem

Day 9 Thursday – May 30 - Jerusalem

Begin the day at the **Garden Tomb** where we view the **Hill of the Skull** and walk into the empty tomb. A communion service provides an opportunity to reflect on Jesus' sacrifice and His victory over death. Ministers from your group will lead the service. Next we visit the room of the **Last Supper**, also known as the site of the **Upper Room**, passing the traditional site of the **Tomb of King David**, we take a short walk through the Jewish Quarter to visit the **Temple Institute**. www.templeinstitute.org The Temple Institute's goal is to see Israel rebuild the Holy Temple on Mount Moriah in Jerusalem, in accord with biblical commandments. Finally, a short walk through the **Roman Cardo**. Traveling to the **Israeli Museum** we will visit the **2nd Temple model** of Jerusalem and the **Dead Sea scrolls** (discovered in the caves of Qumran) among other antiquities. We'll view the **Knesset Menorah** which is a bronze <u>Menorah</u> weighing 4 tons. It is located opposite the <u>Knesset</u>. It was presented to the Knesset as a gift from the Parliament of the United Kingdom on April 15, 1956 in honor of the eighth anniversary of Israeli independence.

Drive to the **International Biblical College of Jerusalem** on Jaffa Street for a classroom session and worship service. The professor will give his final lecture, assignments, and instruction to the students. This will be an opportunity for the professors to speak and wrap up the incredible study tour. A service of reflection and gratitude will be held with our UPCI representatives in Israel & Palestine. Tammy and Shawn Turner will host the meeting. The facility overlooks the city of Jerusalem. The spectacular view is an awesome spiritual experience as we contemplate our study tour thus far. Return to the hotel for dinner. **Dinner and Overnight - Jerusalem**

Day 10 Friday – May 31 - Jerusalem, The City of Our King

After breakfast, the group will enjoy shopping on Ben Yehuda Street and the Shuk (Mahane Yehuda Market). Local conditions permitting, we will drive to Shiloh. As time allows, the group may visit the Western Wall again to pray with the Israelis at the beginning of Shabbat (sundown).

Dinner and Overnight - Jerusalem

Day11 Saturday – June 1 - Farewell Dinner

After breakfast, the group will check out of the hotel and late afternoon, enjoy a **Farewell dinner** and arrive at the Ben Gurion International Airport, Tel Aviv **four hours prior to the return flight departure.** The airline will depart prior to or shortly after midnight. (*Flights to be to be announced soon*)

Day 12 Sunday – June 2 - Arrive in USA

Arrived in the USA and clear immigration and customs. Re-check bags and arrive at the gate for your departure to the destination city.

The city of Petra, capital of the Nabataean Arabs, is one of the most famous archaeological sites in the world, it is Located 240 km south of the capital Amman and 120 km north of the red sea town of Aqaba, Petra the world wonder is undoubtedly Jordan's most valuable treasure and greatest tourist attraction, and it is visited by tourists from all over the world. It is not known precisely when Petra was built, but the city began to prosper as the capital of the Nabataean Empire from the 1st century BC, which grew rich through trade in frankincense, myrrh, and spices. Petra was later annexed to the Roman Empire and continued to thrive until a large earthquake in 363 AD destroyed much of the city in the 4th century AD. The earthquake combined with changes in trade routes, eventually led to the downfall of the city which was ultimately abandoned. By the middle of the 7th century Petra appears to have been largely deserted and it was then lost to all except local Bedouin from the area. In 1812 a Swiss explorer named Johannes Burckhardt set out to 'rediscover' Petra; he dressed up as an Arab and convinced his Bedouin guide to take him to the lost city, after this,

Petra became increasingly known in the West as a fascinating and beautiful ancient city, and it began attracting visitors and continues to do so today. Petra is also known as the rose-red city, a name it gets from the wonderful color of the rock from which many of the city's structures were carved. The Nabataeans buried their dead in intricate tombs that were cut out of the mountain sides and the city also had temples, a theater, and following the Roman annexation and later the Byzantine influence, a colonnaded street and churches. In addition to the magnificent remains of the Nabataean city, human settlement and land use for over 10,000 years can be traced in Petra, where great natural, cultural, archaeological and geological features merge. On December 6, 1985, Petra was designated a World Heritage Site, also Petra was chosen by the Smithsonian Magazine as one of the 28 places you should visit before you die.

After lunch in Petra, we journey toward the Luxury Bedouin Tent Village in Wadi Rum. Upon arriving, we leave the coach and ride open-back jeeps to the camp. Retreat to your private Bedouin style tent with its surrounding expanse of silken sand and luxurious accommodation. Wadi Rum Night camp consist of twenty-five fully equipped luxury tents, each spacious guest tent is luxuriously furnished complete with comfortable king-size, twin, or triple beds, Bedouin sofa, mirrors, lamps, and the finest bed linens.
